Newsletter July 2007

We don't want to get Riaan cross again or it could seriously affect our shooting.

The Good Hope Shooting range has been accredited by SABS. This holds a lot of benefit for us as a club as in future all our shoots are on an accredited facility. There are certain requirements that we will also have to meet. One of them in particular is the wearing of safety glasses, ear protection and helmets in the butts. We are addressing the issue and may well be equipped by the next shoot.

I was informed after the shoot that some members were charging their magazines. SABU rules state very clearly that you are to load one round only prior to each shot and that the magazine, **under no circumstances**, is to be charged. Contravention will result in you being disqualified and removed from the range. I appeal to all, please ensure that it does not happen again. Treat the rifle as a single shot.

The next shoot will be something different. We will not be shooting the 900m as targets will not be available. The targets are being prepared for the World Long Range Muzzle Loader Championship early in September. We shoot a distance never before shot by this club, use a target that is strange to most of us and it may well be dam difficult. All our normal rules and sequence of fire will however prevail and the scores will count to the championship. If it proves to be a success we may well repeat it every year.

Our next event is the "Brak" which is short for the Brakkefontein Bisley.

Bare mentioned the issue of drug free sport in the clubhouse, but for the benefit of those who were not there, here is the short version. We are affiliated to national bodies such as SABU, SASSF and SASCOC and we have to abide by their rules. These organisations can at any time arrive on the range at a club shoot and do drug testing. They arrive unannounced and don't only test winners! And the SABU constitution has very specific recommendations with regards to positive drug tests. Please take the time and effort to go through the right procedures to have your prescription medication approved by having your doctor complete the SABU Exemption form. You will find all the information and forms on the SABU (www.sanra.co.za/sa championship.htm) website. If you have any doubts about the medication you take (even overthe-counter medication), please contact me so that I can check it out for you.
