NEWSLETTER JULY 2010

What an absolutely excellent turnout we had for the 800Mtr!!!

This is a distance that hardly ever gets more than 40 shooters. There must be something we are doing right! Many thanks to the 57 shooters who braved both the cold weather and the distance. For some of you it resulted in joy, and then for others, heartbreak!

The 800Mtrs is not that difficult in fair conditions, but with a nasty tail wind blowing rather strongly, it made the shoot very difficult indeed!

I have managed to have 40 new flags made for the Bisley Range. These are flags which belong to the range and will be used solely for Bisley shooting. Riaan Muller has marked all the flags with numbers. When collecting the flags from him, you will have to sign for them. They are all numerically marked, so if you do perhaps forget one in your car etc, you will be liable for the cost of it. We will have to put the flags up and also take them down ourselves in future. This way Riaan has control over them.

Having said that, I would like to thank Julian v/d Westhuizen and his team who put the flags up. Also, thanks to Michael Beardwood and his team for taking them down. Thanks guys, this is a job that will have to be done before and after all our shoots.

As usual, the shoot was preceded with our customary prayer by John Ecclestone. Many thanks John.

We started the detail at about 9.15am. There were a few really hilarious happenings on the range while the shooters were getting ready. One of these, was the weird choice of colours for a shooting jacket, shooting mat and rifle bag. Not only did you have to wear sunglasses to look at these colourful articles, I had to shoot with my handkerchief near me to wipe the tears from my eyes from constantly laughing. Before we started, I had a brief chat with all the shooters. One of the things I said a few times, was the word "impossible." With that wind blowing and some of our shooters getting mixed up with their left and right, I heard that word on many, many occasions! "But I have just shot a Bull and now they are showing me a miss! It's impossible!!!" When I go over to the shooter and tell them that there was a 5 minute change in the wind strength, I also notice that they have corrected the windage the wrong way. I then put on about 11 minutes wind in the right direction and they are once again back on the paper. Challenging to say the least!

During the shoot, plenty people came to me and enquired if there is a "workshop" where they can get briefed about wind settings, flag reading etc. **I have spoken to a few of the more experienced shooters and I have decided to hold a "workshop" one Saturday in November.** You can then bring your firearms and we will try and explain the finer points of shooting to you. We will cover everything from wind reading, marking, and scoring, to sight picture. Depending on the amount of people interested, we could have a braai or potjie afterwards. We will not restrict this workshop to 303's. Scoped rifles will also be welcome. ***Could those people interested in attending this workshop, please send me a mail advising me of your intention to attend. It would be from about 8.30am to about 2pm. I will wait for your positive response!***

3. TIPS AND HINTS FROM THE “OLD TOPPIE” ... for the shooting party

The name of the game in shooting is “bullet placement”. No matter if it is in the head or “boiler room” or on paper in the V bull!

How do we get there? (Easy for the young lady!!) Read on:-

- 3.1. First and foremost, LISTEN to the range officer and do as he commands. If you are not certain, or deaf, put up your hand and wait for him/her to rectify the situation. SAFETY, SAFETY, SAFETY!
- 3.2. Automatic alignment is of paramount importance! Take a sight picture and close your eyes. You will be off target when you open them. Move your body to correct the sight picture. Close your eyes again. You would have moved too far! (I will put a Kruger Rand on this). Move back halfway and do it all over again until you are on target.
- 3.3. With the good sight picture, check your breathing and squeeze the trigger. (After taking up the slack). The shot should go off as a complete surprise. WITHIN 5 (five) seconds! Hold the aim longer and you will develop a growing shake. Rest for a few seconds and aim again. You have lots of time.
- 3.4. Aim after and through the shot. (Follow through) This will prevent you from flinching or pulling, then the bullet will not go where you are aiming. (You do not notice this as it happens so quickly). This will prevent the most difficult fault to cure. FLINCHING!
- 3.5. If you do the above, your scores should improve by 100%.
