Here is his first contribution.....

“Ou Toppie’s” Tips and Hints for the butt’s party

- 1) Just remember, you can be the best shottist in the club, but if the marker does not mark the fall and value of the shot correctly, you may as well save the ammo for another day.
- 2) After the shot is fired, the shooter will expect the target to be pulled down at once and marked so that he / she can get on with the next shot. At the squeeze of trigger, the marker will be waiting!
- 3) To facilitate speed, if the shot has fallen in the black, keep a black patch on your thumb nail, or a white patch if needed. This will save time in rotating the target quickly.
- 4) Observe strict radio procedure, and when not calling or answering, keep your finger OFF the “send” button, as a carrier wave will be transmitted, drowning out the shottists request.
- 5) Whenever a target score is queried the marker **MUST PULL DOWN THE TARGET AND REMOVE THE MARKER** to examine same.
- 6) Do not look at the target, but watch the backstop, and therefore know that a shot has arrived for you to mark.
- 7) Know that the marker is the most important person on the range after a shot has been fired.
